Because of shipping time, I needed to place the order as soon as possible and interested participants gave me their names at the October meeting. Bio: Lisa Shepard Stewart is a writer and designer based in New Jersey. Her obsession with African textiles began in 1986, during a trip to Senegal, West Africa. She has written 3 project books, offers classes and events internationally, and travels to Ghana to source artists, fabrics and materials. She also organizes and hosts SewJourns to Ghana, Colorado, New Mexico, and other fun destinations.

Lisa opened CE's first studio location in downtown Rahway, NJ in December 2017. The space combines retail and event space for classes and private parties. Faraway customers can shop all the studio's merchandise by way of Virtual Visits, personal shopping appointments via Zoom, WhatsApp or Google Duo video call apps.

In addition to sewing and fabric collecting, she is a part-time vegetarian whose other interests include travel, entertaining, holistic health, and yoga.

Lecture: GLOBAL Textile Influences explores a variety of fabric techniques from around the world, the cultures that created them, and how to incorporate them into quilting & home decor projects. Based partly on Lisa's second book, Global Expressions.

SEWING CLASS FOR MIGRANT WOMEN

We began the sewing class for migrant women at Catholic Charities on Wednesday, Sept. 27

and are off to a great start. We currently have a group of seven very enthusiastic women, who are eager to learn skills from how to thread a sewing machine to how to design and sew a quilt pattern. Susan Wolman began by teaching them how to make multiple design choices using half square triangles, using paper pieces. They moved on to making small quilt blocks with fabric and now are completing their small Quilts using those blocks. The next project is making tote bags and everyone is looking forward to starting those in November.



There was a great response to our request for Christmas fabric. Many VSQ members contributed their time and resources (fabric, pins, needles, pressing mat, etc.) for this project. We will be using these pieces to create beautiful Christmas Tree napkins, using a Jordan Fabrics design. We hope that the migrant women can make enough of these to sell for the holidays and earn a little money. We could not have done this without the help of the following members:

Quilt labels are available at the meetings. Check with Donna Greene or Maria Eyckmans if you need one.

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




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
