SEWING CLASS FOR MIGRANT WOMEN

Our last class with the *Women in Action* at Catholic Charities was on February 28. The last project was to work on aprons and place mats. The students decided to make coordinating aprons and placemats with the fabric we provided. They were very diligent and worked so fast that they were able to complete matching mother/daughter aprons. So cute. One woman was working quickly to complete an apron for her daughter's birthday that same day.



In the previous class, the women had learned how to make tote bags. On the last day of class, the students came in with their completed tote bags and were able to sell some to the Catholic Charities staff. We were so proud of their work. It was exactly what we had hoped for - for them to make projects that they could sell and earn a little money to support their families. They are planning to continue making more tote bags, aprons, and placemats to sell at a "Pop-Up" event in May around Mother's Day.

We had two young visitors on the last day. Susan Wolman was delighted to teach the 10-year-old how to use a sewing machine. She did an excellent job sewing a small tote bag for her little niece. We were again feasted with delicious Mexican food. It was a great day all around. We want to thank all the VSQ members who so generously donated so many items that these women needed to learn how to sew new projects. Initially, they learned how to make small quilt projects that were converted into pillows. Then, throughout the year, they made Christmas napkins, larger quilt patterns converted into full size bed quilts, tote bags, aprons, and placemats. Thank you to all who participated in this VSQ outreach program.
