How to make a Big Board

Supply List: 2 foot by 4 foot piece of ¾ inch plywood. This may be purchased precut

at Home Depot or similar stores.

Duct tape cut in several 6 to 8 inch strips

Staple Gun (optional)

Batting

11/2 yard of muslin fabric

Dining table or other large work surface

- 1. Cut 2 to 4 pieces of batting depending on thickness desired 30 by 50 inches or enough to wrap around edges of board.
- 2. Place muslin flat on work surface.
- 3. Center batting over muslin. Muslin may be trimmed at this point to fit better.
- 4. Center plywood over batting
- 5. Avoiding lumps and keeping fabric taut, wrap muslin and batting to back of plywood and affix using staple gun or duct tape. This can be a one step or two step process. Work opposite sides first and then add extra tape/staples to corners.
- 6. Cover staples with duct tape to prevent future injury.
- 7. Place on regular ironing board and enjoy.

Approximate cost of plywood is \$15.00
