A MESSAGE FROM VSQ PRESIDENT DONNA GREENE

Dear VSQ-ers,

Sunflowers have never had so much symbolism as they do today. Sadly, it may be a while until this is replaced by one of the several flowers of peace (white lily, peace rose, poppy, lavender and more. See https://symbolismandmetaphor.com/flowers-that-symbolize-peace/)

As a group and as individuals, our Guild has been stepping up to do its small part to help the Ukrainians.

- At our last meeting, Barbara Glab collected cash and children's quilts to help young refugees now in Poland. (See elsewhere in this newsletter for the update from Barbara.)
- With funds raised from my latest fabric sale in my driveway, we have made donations of \$750 each to Doctors Without Borders and Chef Central Kitchen, two impressive non-profits that are working on the ground to bring food and other aid to the Ukrainians who are under siege.
- At our last meeting, we decided that our raffle quilt will feature the blue and yellow
 colors of Ukraine and that a portion of the raffle proceeds will go to assist the
 Ukrainian people. The specific organization or organizations will be selected by the
 membership at our meeting, Tuesday, April 12. Thank you to Rose Fox for
 masterminding this quilt. We still need someone to take ownership of ticket sales. It's
 an easy job: distribute the tickets to members, collect the returned tickets and money
 and turn the funds over to our treasurer.

SUPPORT FOR UKRAINIAN REFUGEES IN POLAND

An update from the Editor

VSQ (and NSQG) member, Barbara Glab, had heard from relatives and friends in Poland about some Ukrainian refugees, especially children, taking shelter in a school in a small town in Poland. Barbara described the situation to the guild – especially the need for money for

basic medical, hygiene and other supplies. With generous support from VSQ and NSQG members at their respective March meetings, Barbara collected from VSQ \$645 and from NSQG \$1,065; adding in a donation from her family, Barbara sent a total of \$2,000 to Poland to help the Ukrainian refugees. In addition, 46 lap size quilts were donated and sent to Poland.

In Barbara's words: "I would like to thank everyone for such generous donations."

Some of you may remember dancing to Stevie Wonder's song, Signed, Sealed, Delivered I'm



Yours. The Village Squares Quilters collaboration last Summer and Fall with the Hudson River Museum reminded me of this song. Maureen Carline and I worked with the staff of the Hudson River Museum to create two quilts during their exhibition, **Wall Power**. During this exhibition visitors were invited to join the VSQ volunteers to sew together four squares to create a quilt block. Maureen designed the quilt pattern and painstakingly marked the sewing lines for each of the fabric squares. The result was the creation of two quilts that measure 92" x 82" (see left) and another that measures 52" x 52" (see below). These two quilts were delivered to the Museum mid-March, and are being donated to Furniture Sharehouse, an organization that works with families transitioning from homeless shelters to permanent housing. What a wonderful place for these quilts to end up - signed, sealed and delivered.

I would like to again thank all the VSQ volunteers who gave of their time and talent to help visitors to the museum learn or perfect their sewing skills. I especially want to thank Maureen for all the countless hours she gave to this project; Janice Ewing, who quilted the larger of the two quilts and all the helpers who came on Saturdays to help visitors sew



the blocks together. Among them were Mary Anne Byrnes, Alice Clague, Diane Coldrick, Georgina Correa, Rose Fox, and Judy Simek.


