Tuesday, April 12: This will now be our annual Members-Teaching-Members. The board and the membership overwhelmingly indicated they want this to be in person. So, unless we have a weather problem or COVID-related restriction, this is our plan. The idea is to learn a short technique from a handful of sister VSQ-ers. For our original January schedule, 5 members had volunteered to each (briefly) demonstrate a technique. Hopefully, they (and maybe more) will be available for our April program.

OTHER VSQ THINGS:

- We have teamed up with the Westchester Children's Association to help this wonderful organization assemble a community quilt for installation sometime in the fall. WCA has sent blank cotton five-inch quilt blocks to about 3,000 supporters as part of its Hope Quilt Project. We will be the co-sponsor of the event and guide the organization on this project. The steering committee is Susan Wolman, Janet Bozzone, new member Laura Lustbader and me. (Others are welcome, just let me know.) Once we have a plan and design, other VSQ members will be invited to help with the assembly.
- Jean Borsellino has taken on the task of being our New Members' Liaison. With her friendly and helpful manner, she is the perfect person to make sure our new members feel welcome at our guild.
- Speaking of new members—we need them. If you know someone who might be interested in joining our guild, please invite her/him to attend as a guest.
- If you haven't already turned in your diamond pieces for the raffle quilt that Rose is masterminding, please bring them to the January meeting. Rose needs at least 200 completed diamonds. Don't do the trimming.
- We are still collecting dues for the fiscal year that began August 2021 and continues until July 2022. If you haven't paid your dues, please bring \$45 to the January meeting or email me for the snail mail address.
- And finally, welcome back home, Shel Hoffman. We are so glad you and Carole, who we've seen at our last two meetings, are both healing.
