## HUDSON RIVER MUSEUM QUILT PROJECT – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

#### Overview:

The Village Squares Quilters (VSQ) Guild is pleased to join the Hudson River Museum (HRM) in promoting its 2021 Summer Exhibit – **Wall Power** – an exhibition of Quilts from the American Folk Art Museum.

In support of this exhibition, VSQ members, in cooperation with the HRM, will provide basic instruction on how to select fabric, stitch together small, 4-patch blocks and create a quilt to donate to a local charity. Members of the community will be encouraged to join us in this creative process, learn a few basic hand sewing skills and create a work of art.

The Museum will be open on the following Saturdays for this community project:

- July 10 and July 24
- August 7 and August 21
- September 4 and September 18.

#### **Volunteers Needed:**

As noted above, VSQ and the Hudson River Museum will be holding mini quilt sessions on the following Saturdays this summer: July 10 and July 24; August 7 and August 21; September 4 and September 18. Each VSQ volunteer would teach Museum visitors a simple running stitch to piece four pieces of fabric together i.e., a 4-patch (see right). All sewing will be done by hand. The completed blocks will be collected and, later joined by VSQ members to make a full-size quilt. The completed quilt will be donated to a local charity selected jointly by HRM and VSQ.



All the materials needed for this activity will be provided by the Museum. In addition to the VSQ volunteers, the Museum will also have several junior docents to assist the visitors in selecting fabric and sewing the pieces together.
