#### **HUDSON RIVER MUSEUM QUILT PROJECT**

The Hudson River Museum (HRM) is organizing a Quilt Show this summer titled "**Wall Power.**" They have on loan Quilts from the American Folk-Art Museum, which will be displayed at the Hudson River Museum **June 18**<sup>th</sup> though **September 26, 2021.** The Quilts in their own collection will also be on display.

Laura Vookles, Chair of the HRM Curatorial Department contacted me and arranged a Zoom meeting to discuss the VSQ Quilting Program at Bedford Hills Correctional Facility (Bedford). In her words they, "...wanted to spotlight guilds with a community connection." She had seen the clip of the Bedford Babies Anniversary Celebration shown on News 12 Westchester and was interested in displaying any quilts made by the Mothers at Bedford. On this call we also had Maureen Carline, Saralinda Lichtblau, Director of Education and Nancy Denatale, Director of Development at HRM.

Maureen and I described the program at Bedford and stressed that the quilts made by the Mothers at Bedford were not available to us. We do have two quilts that the Mothers made and gave to us, in appreciation of the work we do at Bedford. I have those two quilts and will gladly lend them to the HRM. We also discussed our participation in this project. We agreed that once the HRM had finalized their activities and had an idea of how we could help, we would reach out to the VSQ membership and ask for volunteers.

Some of the help they may need include training their summer interns some basic quilting skills that they would then share with Museum visitors; participating in a sew along with visitors; creating connections between quilts and poetry, math, storytelling etc. As the project takes a more specific shape and form, we can explore different ways that VSQ could collaborate with HRM.

Maureen and I believe this is a worthy collaboration. It will help us recruit more members and, most importantly, help us share our love of quilting with others.
