Hello my friends and fellow quilters,

In a blink of an eye, two-thirds of 2021 is gone.

Having said that we are *aiming* (notice the word aiming) to resume in person meetings beginning with Sept. 14. We are prepared to turn on a dime if we have to readjust to Zoomonly. But for now, here is an overview of our plans:

We do not have a specific program for this get together – but we will do Show'n'Tell. **Bring your lunch**. The church will provide coffee and tea.

**Raffle quilt 2022:** Rose Fox has volunteered to organize a raffle quilt. She will be distributing fabric kits at the September meeting in the colorway the membership decided on in June.

- **Tuesday, Oct. 12**: We hope to be back in person at Westchester Reform Temple. Between COVID and the Jewish holidays, WRT asked us to defer our return there until October. I will confirm this in the weeks ahead, because COVID could change this if WRT has to continue to use "our" space to spread out its nursery school. Our scheduled presenter is Natalya Khorover, who is a whiz at repurposing traditional "fabrics" for quilts. She lives in Westchester.
- **Tuesday, Nov. 9 & Dec. 14:** We have booked in person speakers. Details in future newsletters.

• January 2022-June 2022: We have an assortment of planned programs including some via Zoom (to avoid snow). And of course we will have a charity sewing day and our "members teaching members" events.

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#### OTHER GUILD THINGS

- As of this writing, we have a couple of September dates left for our initiative with the **Hudson River Museum**. Thank you to those who organized this (Doris Capello and Maureen Carline) and those who volunteered to help. (See elsewhere in this newsletter for a wrap up on this project.)
- Free batting for charity projects: Maria Eyckmans and Janet Bozzone made a trek to Connecticut to pick up a lot of free batting. This is available to us but exclusively for charity quilts. Let Maria know if you need some.
- On a related note, Deb of Pins & Needles is once again collecting baby quilts for Beacon Health Care and Blythedale. Deb put together some kits, so if you are interested in making one or more, let Lee Kimmel know. (Then get some free batting from Maria!) These need to be completed by early December, as they are meant to be holiday donations.
- Ethan Allen in Hartsdale reached out to us via our Facebook page, after one of its executives heard a rebroadcast of Susan Wolman's MOTH story about a 9/11 quilt. (Thank you to Laurie Q., who created and monitors our FB page and who turned the contact info over to me.) They have lots of discarded fabric books (some cotton, some not), space for us to hold events and even space for us to hold a mini quilt show. If you would like to help me explore some of these options, particularly a possible mini quilt show at the store, let me know.
